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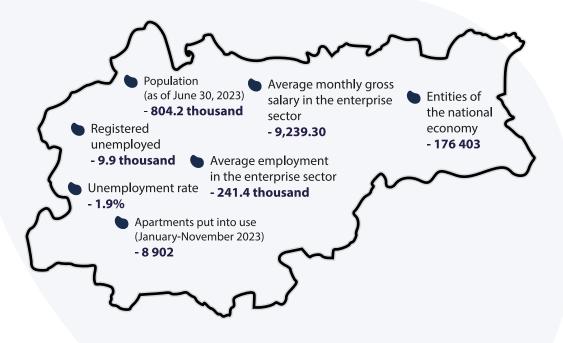

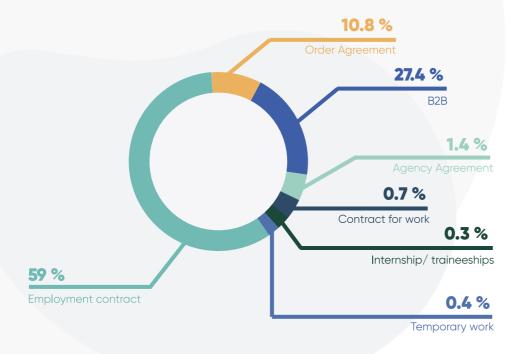

Kraków has been at the forefront of regions with the highest average salaries for years. Good career perspectives and development opportunities are important here. Many industries report higher rates than in other parts of the country. The beginning of January 2023 constitutes the month in which Kraków overtook Warsaw for the first time in terms of compiling average salaries. This proves a stable situation on the labour market in this city.

According to the Central Statistical Office, the average gross monthly salary in the enterprise sector in March 2023 in Kraków amounted to PLN 10,051 and was 13.2% higher than in March 2022, and the increase was recorded, among others, in the following sections: accommodation and catering (+31.4%), transport and warehouse management (+18.0%), administration and support activities (+15.8%), trade (+12.3%), industry (+12.3%).

The benefits offered by companies vary depending on the position, place of work, the situation of a given person, and the internal culture of the organization. When working remotely, reimbursement of costs incurred for Internet access or electricity, as well as flexible working hours are important. Whereas, in an office, the possibility of coming to work with a child may turn out to be much more important.

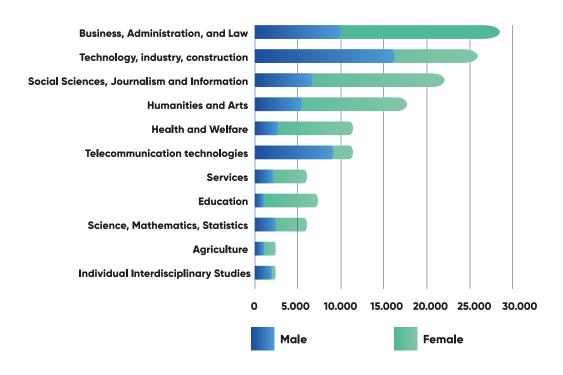

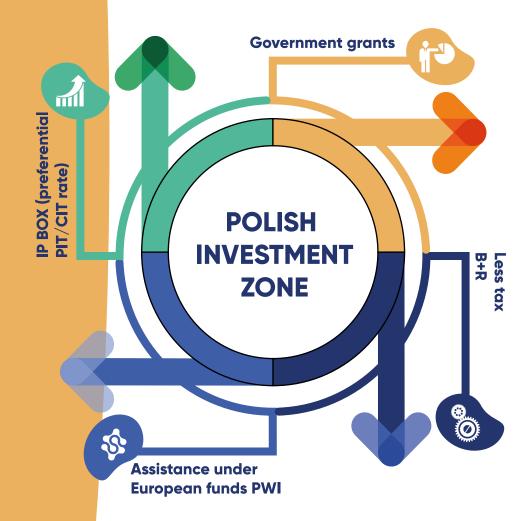

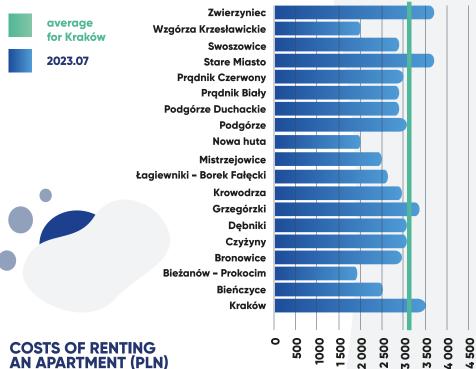

After 25 years of operation, the Motorola Solutions R&D Software Centre in Kraków has become a pearl in the crown among corporate centres in the world and the largest centre of the company outside the USA. The decision to open the centre in Kraków was mainly based on access to qualified technical staff with a wide range of specializations in the field of software engineering and location in the middle of the EMEA region, enabling us to provide support to our European customers. International communication possibilities through the airport in Balice, access to a good base of local suppliers, and a telecommunications network with the required parameters were also important factors.

When we've started our business, we thought about a maximum of several hundred employees, mainly in the field of creating specialized software. Currently, more than 2600 Motorolans create critical communication software, command centres, intelligent public security applications, and video analytics. We have, among others, finance, supply chain, and purchasing departments, documentation and training, customer support, IT, and powerful equipment laboratories. Kraków is a great place to live and run a business, and in our case the best possible location choice, thanks to which we are constantly developing dynamically.
