CALL FROM THE PAST CYBERSEC European Cybersecurity Forum



Close co-operation between Central and Eastern Europe countries regarding cybersecurity, EU's increasing digital potential and strong transatlantic bonds in this respect – these were the main themes of the 4th European Cybersecurity Forum – CYBERSEC 2018, taking place on 8-9 October 2018 in Kraków. This conference, organised by the Kosciuszko Institute, is one of the most important events devoted to cybersecurity in Europe.

The CYBERSEC Forum provided two days of intense debates, over 140 speakers and over 1,000 participants from all over the world. Similarly to previous years, debates were held within four thematic fields: State, Defence, Future and Business. The panels focused on, inter alia, trust in cyberspace, cyber autonomy, blockchain technology and quantum computing. The issue of personal data protection in the digital world, which is extremely valid due to GDPR, was also discussed. The idea of the Digital Three Seas, initiated by the Kosciuszko Institute, and co-operation of CEE countries on cybersecurity were one of the most important subjects discussed during the Forum.

Kraków, similarly to previous years, took the honorary patronage over the Forum.

Cybersecurity is crucial for the entity, which in its strategic plans puts forward the development of SMART TECHNOLOGIES. The situation is no different in the case of Krakow.

Safe and stable communication systems are indispensable for developing an intelligent economy, mobility, modern forms of management or raising the quality of life. This also applies to the use of electronic service platforms or the provision of urban data in the form of open data.

Kraków is indicated in the "Plan for Responsible Development" of the Ministry of Development as a potential location of "Cyberpark Enigma", which aim is to develop the competences of Polish companies and scientific research units in the field of cybersecurity and data analysis. As a result, a center of specialized IT services is to be created, which can compete on the European market. The "Cyberpark Enigma" project will have a network-centric character and its main centers will be Warsaw, Krakow, Wroclaw, Poznan and the Tri-City. The concept of the "Cyberpark Enigma" program, assumptions:

- · accessible infrastructure,
- supercomputer, data center,
- highly qualified scientific staff,
- SME sector from the IT industry

In Kraków, there are universities that have all the tools to educate specialists dealing with cybersecurity – first of all specialists dealing with the technological dimension of cybersecurity, but also humanists – lawyers, political scientists who will understand that cybersecurity is not only a technological but a strategic dimension. It is all the more necessary because all data show how much the cybersecurity specialists are lacking.
